Hotel Options -

Premier Inn (Walkergate)

Located in the heart of the City centre and is around a 20 minute walk to the conference venue.



<u>Delta Hotel by Marriott - Royal County Hotel</u>

Situated on Old Elvet, near various pubs and restaurants in the city and is a 10 minute walk to the conference venue.



Travelodge Durham

Located on Gilesgate roundabout, with direct links to the A1 motorway. Further out of the city to the above named hotels. It would take a 30 minute walk to the conference venue.



The Kingslodge Inn, Durham

Closest hotel to Durham Train Station. It would also take around a 30 minute walk to the conference venue.

Conference Dinner Venue - Hatfield College

Hatfield College is right in the city centre, nestling beneath Durham's magnificent Cathedral. The College buildings are an interesting blend of Georgian coaching inn, early Victorian room sets and major additions during the last century.

The early Georgian Dining Hall is where the conference dinner will be taking place on Wednesday 30th July.





Founded in 1846, Hatfield College is the second oldest College in Durham University.

Notable locations to visit in the City

Durham Cathedral

Durham Cathedral was built in the late 11th and early 12th centuries to house the relics of St Cuthbert (evangelizer of Northumbria) and the Venerable Bede. The Cathedral is iconic within the City and can be seen from miles around in neighbouring towns and villages within County Durham.

Durham Castle

Sitting at the heart of Durham's World Heritage Site and occupied continuously since the 11th century, the Castle is now home to the students of University College, part of Durham University. Visitors are welcome to join guided tours.
